We have been busy in the garden already this term. We picked and enjoyed some delicious rock melons and harvested some more of our sunflower seeds from our sunflowers.








Port Power Visit

We extend our heartfelt condolences to Sue's family and friends during this difficult time. As a school community we are grieving the loss of Sue.

Sue's dedication to education and her unwavering commitment to our school community has left an indelible mark on all of us. She will be remembered for her significant contribution to the Robertstown Primary School and wider community on her 30 years of service here. Sue began teaching at Robertstown Primary School in 1994, bringing her passion for education into the classroom. In Term 3 of 2015, Sue took on the role of Principal, where she continued to lead with compassion, integrity and a vision for excellence. We hold Sue's memory as we continue to learn and grow at school.
